


- 1. Education levels and tax base are projected to decline




# Race/Ethnic Gaps in Educational Attainment Bode Poorly for California's Workforce


Percent of Adults Ages 25 to 64 With an Associates Degree or Higher


Projected Change in the Number of 25 to 64 Year Olds from 2000 to 2020






# California's Per Capita Income will Fall Below U.S. Average if Race/Ethnic Education Gaps Remain







#### Preparation for College

- + Among top states in % of 8th graders taking Algebra; substantial gains in recent years
- + About 2/3 of secondary school students taught by teachers with appropriate subject area major
- Rank 35th in share of high school students taking advanced math; 49th in advanced science
- In the bottom 1/5 in 8th graders scoring "proficient" in *all* subject areas of the NAEP
- Large gaps by region and racial/ethnic group




#### Racial/Ethnic Gaps in Preparation






#### Regional Gaps in Preparation






#### Participation in College

- + Among top states in % of population enrolled
  - Traditional college-age: 18 to 24
  - Working adults: 25-64
- Very low rates of patterns that lead to completion
  - 40<sup>th</sup> in high school grads direct to college
  - 48<sup>th</sup> in share of students enrolled full-time
- Huge gaps in college participation




# Racial/Ethnic Gaps in Participation




Direct college-going rate

9th graders enrolling in college within 4 years




### College Participation by Race/Ethnicity

White	43%	5.8%
Black	32%	8.8%




# Regional Gaps in Participation




Direct college-going rate

9th graders enrolling in college within 4 years




#### Completion of Degrees/Certificates

- + Rank 11<sup>th</sup> on 6-year graduation rate of fulltime freshmen at universities
  - Does not include part-time students, or students who begin in community college
- Rank 47<sup>th</sup> in the number of BA degrees per 100 undergraduates enrolled
- Rank 46<sup>th</sup> in degrees/certificates awarded per 100 students enrolled in 2-year colleges




# Certificates and Degrees Awarded per 100 Undergraduates Enrolled, 2005





